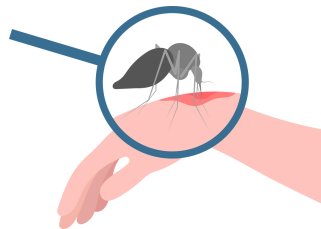
Surge in Chikungunya and Dengue Cases in Pune

Pune is experiencing a significant rise in chikungunya and dengue cases, according to the Pune Municipal Corporation (PMC). Chikungunya cases have surged dramatically, increasing from 24 in July to 225 in September. Similarly, dengue cases have sharply risen, with numbers climbing from 34 in July to 168 in September.

Health officials attribute this alarming increase to seasonal factors and the shared vector for these diseases, the Aedes mosquito. The PMC is intensifying efforts to control the spread of these diseases through extensive fumigation, insecticide spraying and the elimination of mosquito breeding sites.

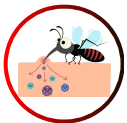
While the city has successfully managed to break the transmission chain of the Zika virus, the focus now shifts to addressing the growing threat of chikungunya and dengue. Experts from the National Institute of Virology with our department of medicine is collaborating with NIV for molecular study in dengue and working with PMC to implement effective containment measures.

The PMC continues to closely monitor the situation and urges residents to take preventive measures, such as protecting themselves from mosquito bites and eliminating stagnant water where mosquitoes breed.

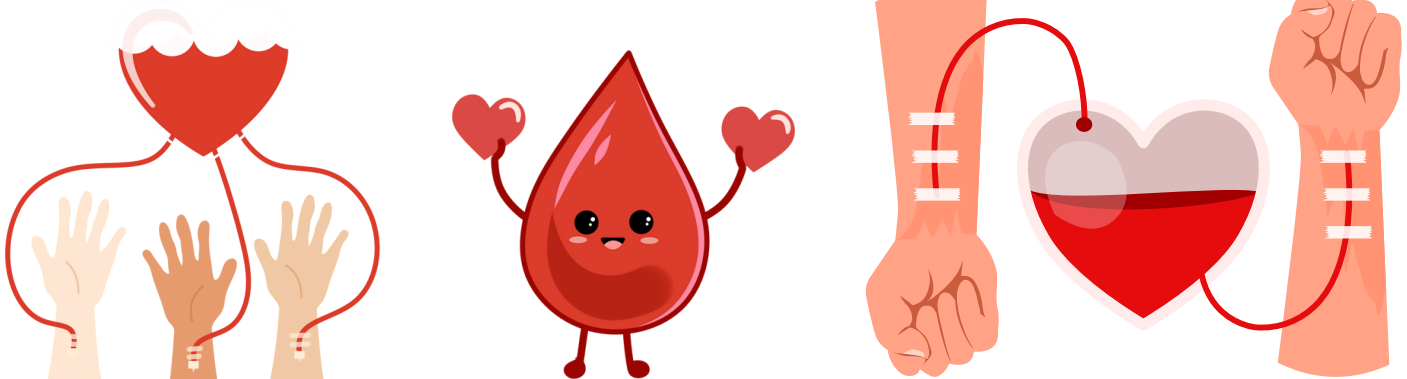


Wellness Program

Our healthcare initiatives reflect the unwavering dedication of both our team and the community. In August, 14 blood donation camps resulted in the collection of 754 units, with key contributions from locations such as the Wellness OPD, Dr. D.Y. Patil ACS College and Sant Savta Mall. Students also recognized the importance of contributing to the cause of a healthier tomorrow. Additionally, 61 blood donations were made in-house by the students and staff of our various institutes.

The milk bank also achieved remarkable results, collecting a total of 82,300 ml out of which 52,150 ml from in-house donors and 30,150 ml from external contributors. Of this, 40,310 ml was distributed to NICU infants.

With 286 milk donors, including five from outside the hospital, these efforts demonstrate the community's strong commitment to saving lives.



Out Reach Program

A multi-diagnostic mega health check-up camp was organized by MLA Mr. Sunil Shelke in collaboration with city hospitals and Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College at Sub District Hospital, Kanhe, Tal. Maval, Dist. Pune. Doctors from various specialties, along with interns, nursing staff and medico-social workers, provided services such as free consultations, medication distribution, physical examinations, investigations and referrals. The camp was a success, thanks to the teamwork, planning and cooperation of the organizers and participants, which ensured smooth coordination throughout.

Resident Diaries

On 3rd October 2024, we had posted one major elective surgery of Modified Radical Mastectomy for a 65-year-old female diagnosed with Breast Cancer. I have been eagerly waiting for an opportunity to perform a major case individually. I was very nervous at the same time, very excited to perform this surgery. I prepared well for the surgery, discussed the care with all our faculties and most importantly with our Breast Onco-surgeon, Dr. Dakshayani Nirhale ma'am our HOD. She guided me with the incision site, various intraoperative complications we might face and how to handle those without panicking. I have been observing and assisting her throughout my residency training, learning all the meticulous techniques and sterile procedure methods and tackling any complications that may arise during the procedure. I was able to identify proper planes of dissection, major structures and secure them, keeping a bloodless surgical field.

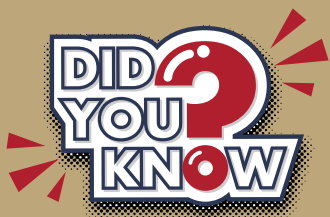


I completed the whole procedure in the given time, without any intraoperative complications. Postoperatively, the patient's surgical site was healthy, and she had no complaints. The level of satisfaction that I felt after seeing the patient very happy, after hearing those heartfelt thank you's from her and her relatives, is undescrivable. This, in itself, is the reward we aim for, being surgeon's. I dreamt of this, to be able to achieve and do something good for patients before I entered the residency program. I am very grateful to this institution for providing us with such modern technologies and thankful to all experienced teachers for their constant support and motivation to perform better with each case.

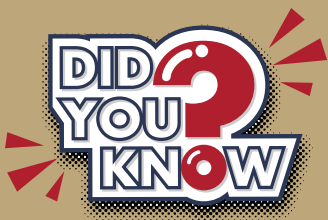

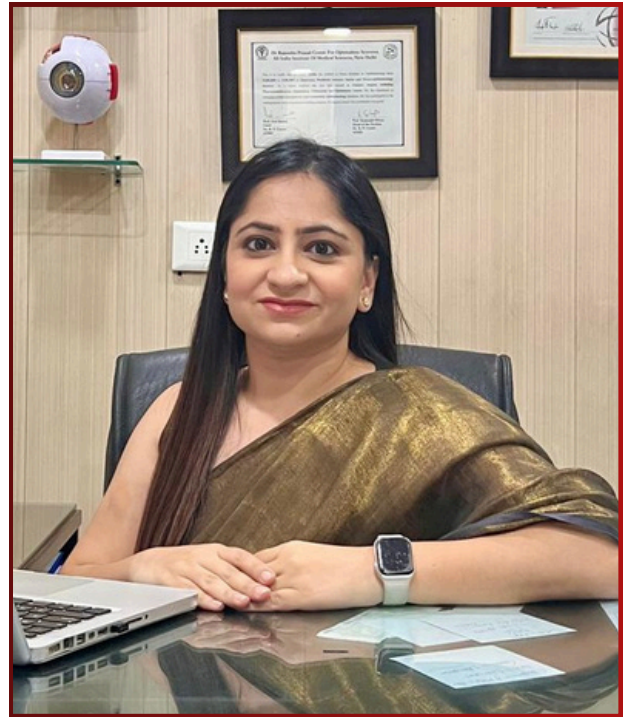

KYF (Know Your Faculty)

In the intricate realm of medical education, few fields are as foundational yet challenging as anatomy. Dr. Preeti Sonje Madam reflects on her journey and reveals how she became an "accidental anatomist." After gaining admission to a prestigious program, she deferred her entry to pursue a career in gynecology or pediatrics. However, encouraged by her husband, she explored a preclinical subject, which ultimately led her to anatomy—a decision that profoundly impacted her career.

Mentors played a key role in her path. Dr. Sheetal Joshi, a senior during her MD, inspired Dr. Sonje's interest in the subject and teaching. Additionally, her postgraduate guide, Dr. Vatsala Swamy Madam, nurtured her passion for anatomy. Reflecting on her influences, Dr. Sonje highlights her father's values of hard work, sincerity and consistency as foundational to her approach to both professional and personal life.

The turning point in her career came when she fully embraced anatomy, realizing its depth and importance. She frequently encounters misconceptions among students, particularly regarding the simplicity of anatomy research. She emphasizes the need for a detailed understanding of the subject and its clinical relevance, stressing that there are no shortcuts in mastering anatomy.

Currently, Dr. Sonje is pioneering innovative approaches in anatomy education, such as soft embalming, which preserves cadavers in a more lifelike state, enhancing the learning experience. She is also expanding the bone bank in her department, allowing students access to real bones for study.

As the organizing secretary of the Society of Clinical Anatomists (SOCA), Dr. Sonje successfully coordinated a significant post-pandemic international conference, demonstrating her commitment to education and organizational excellence.

In balancing her professional and personal life, she emphasizes time management and finds relaxation in exercise, painting and gardening. She enjoys exploring India's landscapes, with recent trips to Ludhiana and Amritsar and prefers traditional Maharashtrian cuisine as her comfort food.

Dr. Sonje Madam's message to students is clear: "Commitment to their studies is essential." A rigorous curriculum demands regular attendance, sincere effort and a healthy balance between academic pursuits and personal well-being. Her journey in the field of anatomy serves as an inspiration to those navigating their own paths in medicine, reminding us that fulfilling journeys often come from unexpected beginnings.

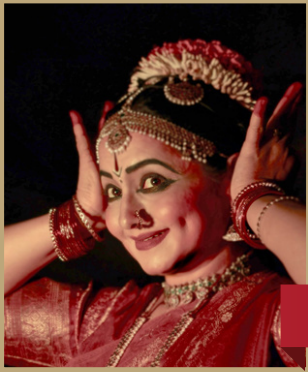
